

Saint John of God (Feast Day: March 8) While living life as a soldier, Saint John of God experienced a religious conversion and dedicated his life to caring for the poor and sick in Spain. He founded the Brothers Hospitallers, which revolutionized care by treating patients with immense dignity, compassion, and organized medical attention. He is venerated as the patron saint of hospitals, nurses, and the sick.



Saint Frances of Rome (Feast Day: March 9) Saint Frances, a devoted wife and mother, served the poor and sick of Rome during times of severe plague and famine, eventually turning her noble home into a hospital. She founded a community of women, the Olivetan Oblates of Mary. According to legend, an angel lit her path during her nighttime charitable errands, leading to her unique patronage as the saint of automobile drivers.

A WORD FROM FR. GREG

As we journey deeper into Lent, I would like to introduce you to the six OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) candidates featured below. Lent is a season of spiritual preparation and enlightenment, and witnessing their journey is a reminder for all of us to renew our own faith.

OCIA prepares individuals to fully enter the Catholic Church through the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and the Holy Eucharist. Because each person's spiritual background is unique, the specific sacraments they receive depend on what they have already experienced. Some will be baptized for the first time, while those already validly baptized, will receive First Communion. Some only require Confirmation to complete their initiation.

We celebrate these sacraments at the Easter Vigil because it is the holiest night of our liturgical year. Just as Christ passed from death to glorious new life, our candidates will step out of the darkness and into the light of Christ.. There is no more fitting moment to welcome new members into the Church than the very night we celebrate the Resurrection!

Please take a moment to read their introductions today, and keep these six candidates in your daily prayers as they prepare for the joy of the Easter Vigil.

MEET THE OCIA CANDIDATES AND CATECHUMENS

Bennet Scott: Hi, I'm a 36 year old firefighter paramedic. Over the years of working in this field I strayed away from religion and recently was asked to be a godfather. I took this very serious and decided I needed to finish my sacraments and find my way back. In my free time I enjoy nature, spending time with friends and golfing. During these last few months, these classes have helped me find my way back to the Lord and church. It has also helped in my personal life with being a better husband.

Ben De Jong: Seven years ago, I immigrated to the United States to marry my wife, Viktoria. Through her, I was introduced to the Catholic Church, and we have been attending Mass together every week. Faith has become an important part of our life, and I find it especially meaningful that our growing family shares the same values and teachings of Jesus.

Last fall, we were blessed with the news that we are expecting a baby girl. For me, this felt like a sign to take the next step in my faith journey, which led me to join OCIA. I am grateful to be preparing for Baptism alongside my future daughter, who will also be baptized this year. I feel truly blessed to be part of this parish community and thankful for my OCIA leader, Sebastian Abbinanti, my fellow candidates, and especially my wife, whose love, faith, and support have guided me every step of the way.

Tricia Ernst: I have a very firm commitment to the Catholic faith, but it hasn't felt complete without the sacrament of Confirmation. I feel receiving Confirmation will further strengthen my role in the faith and service in the community.

W miarę jak coraz głębiej przeżywamy Wielki Post, pragnę przedstawić Wam sześcioro kandydatów programu OCIA (Obrzęd Chrześcijańskiego Wtajemniczenia Dorosłych), których sylwetki znajdują się poniżej. Wielki Post jest czasem duchowego przygotowania i oświecenia, a towarzyszenie im w ich drodze jest dla nas wszystkich przypomnieniem, by odnowić własną wiarę.

OCIA przygotowuje osoby do pełnego włączenia się do Kościoła katolickiego poprzez sakramenty wtajemniczenia: Chrzest, Bierzmowanie oraz Najświętszą Eucharystię. Ponieważ duchowa historia każdej osoby jest wyjątkowa, sakramenty, które przyjmą, zależą od tego, czego już wcześniej doświadczyli. Niektórzy zostaną ochrzczeni po raz pierwszy, inni – już ważnie ochrzczeni – przystąpią do Pierwszej Komunii Świętej. Są też tacy, którzy potrzebują jedynie sakramentu Bierzmowania, aby dopełnić swoje wtajemniczenie.

Sakramenty te celebrowujemy podczas Wigilii Paschalnej, ponieważ jest to najświętsza noc w całym roku liturgicznym. Tak jak Chrystus przeszedł ze śmierci do chwalebego nowego życia, tak nasi kandydaci wyjdą z ciemności ku światłu Chrystusa. Nie ma bardziej odpowiedniego momentu, by powitać nowych członków Kościoła, niż noc, w której celebrowujemy Zmartwychwstanie!

Proszę, poświęćcie chwilę, aby dziś przeczytać ich krótkie przedstawienia, oraz pamiętajcie o tych sześciu kandydatach w codziennej modlitwie, gdy przygotowują się do radości Wigilii Paschalnej.

Will Yucaitis: I am 42 and reside in Homer Glen. Both my lovely wife and seeing my 3 children begin their journey in religious education have inspired me to complete the sacrament of Confirmation. I wish to develop a better relationship and understanding with God. I look forward to continuing my own journey in faith and giving back to this wonderful church.

Dawson Patterson: On July 6, 2025, I was blessed to become a father to my daughter. It was a moment that deeply transformed my life and strengthened my faith. Through her, I felt called to fully commit to my spiritual journey by receiving my First Communion and Confirmation.

I have attended Catholic Mass since 2022, and I have grown closer to God and to the teachings of the Church. Through the OCIA program, my understanding of the Catholic faith has deepened in meaningful ways. Lenten Family Activity *Sundays are for rest and family*

Here's something many Catholic families miss: Sundays during Lent don't count toward the 40 days. **They're mini-Easters.** Every Sunday is a celebration of the Resurrection.

So here's a different way to think about your week: **live OUT of Sunday, not FOR Friday.** What does that mean? It means Sunday is your anchor. Sunday Mass, Sunday family time, Sunday rest. Get your chores done Saturday so Sunday can actually be restful. Make a good breakfast together. Go for a walk after Mass. Play games. Be together without the pressure of productivity.

And here's the beautiful part: if your kids fasted from something on Friday, enjoy it together on Sunday. Skipped dessert Friday? Have ice cream sundaes Sunday afternoon. This teaches them the rhythm of Catholic life. We fast, and we feast.

Third Sunday of Lent

In today's Gospel, we see the Samaritan woman coming to faith. The steps she takes are our steps, too. Though she needs Jesus' help, he approaches her first. He invites us to make the journey of faith long before we start, by putting us into a faithful family, giving us a curious heart that seeks the truth, sending us a friend or spouse whose example draws us to the Lord.

The next step is acknowledging our need and our sinfulness. Admitting our need for God, and especially for God's forgiveness, opens us to God's saving grace. Another step is drawing closer to God in prayer. Jesus tells the woman, and us, that the best worship is honest and from the Spirit.

When we begin to share our faith with others, we take the step of living our faith. Like the woman who told her neighbors about Jesus, we find that the people we have touched begin to find the Lord on their own. Our Catechumens are taking these steps now, thanks to those who have helped them experience Jesus' invitation to faith.

III Niedziela Wielkiego Postu

W dzisiejszej Ewangelii widzimy Samarytankę, która dochodzi do wiary. Kroki, które ona podejmuje, są także naszymi krokami. Choć to ona potrzebuje pomocy Jezusa, to On pierwszy do niej podchodzi. Zaprasza nas do podjęcia drogi wiary jeszcze zanim sami ją rozpoczniemy – stawiając nas w wierzącej rodzinie, dając nam serce ciekawe prawdy, posyłając przyjaciela lub współmałżonka, którego przykład przybliży nas do Pana.

Kolejnym krokiem jest uznanie naszej potrzeby i naszej grzeszności. Przyznanie się do tego, że potrzebujemy Boga – a szczególnie Jego przebaczenia – otwiera nas na Jego zbawczą łaskę. Następnym etapem jest zbliżanie się do Boga w modlitwie. Jezus mówi do Samarytanki – i do nas – że najlepsza modlitwa i uwielbienie są szczere i płyną z Ducha.

Kiedy zaczynamy dzielić się naszą wiarą z innymi, podejmujemy kolejny krok – żyjemy wiarą na co dzień. Tak jak kobieta, która opowiedziała swoim sąsiadom o Jezusie, odkrywamy, że osoby, których serc dotknęliśmy, same zaczynają odnajdywać Pana. Nasi katechumeni podejmują teraz te właśnie kroki, dzięki tym, którzy pomogli im doświadczyć zaproszenia Jezusa do wiary.

St. Joseph's Corner

Nearly halfway through our Lenten journey to Jerusalem, we encounter a familiar story: the Samaritan woman at Jacob's well (cf. John 4:5-42). It is one of the longer Gospel passages in the Sunday lectionary, spanning thirty-eight verses. So substantial is the dialogue that the lectionary permits an abridged form.

The passage is saturated with theological themes—thirst and living water, true worship, revelation, and mission. These themes will rightly anchor many homilies today. Yet the theological depth of the exchange can obscure something equally significant: the context in which it unfolds.

This Gospel appears only in the Gospel of John, traditionally regarded as the last of the four Gospels to be written. John's approach differs markedly from the Synoptics. He favors extended dialogues over compressed narratives, layered symbolism over rapid movement, and progressive revelation over immediate clarity. In that sense, this passage is quintessentially Johannine.

The structure follows John's theological architecture with precision. Jesus is identified in stages—first as a Jew, then as "sir," then as prophet, and finally as Messiah. Water becomes a theological sign. The confession "Savior of the world" emerges not from Jerusalem, but from Samaria.

Yet context matters. The setting, the geography, and the identity of the participants are not incidental details. They are the theological stage itself. John is not merely narrating a private conversion; he is deliberately placing the revelation of Christ at the intersection of ethnic hostility, religious division, and moral ambiguity. The boundaries are not accidental. They are being crossed...



SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION



Baptism: Baptisms are scheduled on the second Sunday of each month. Polish Baptisms are at 1:00 p.m., and English Baptisms are at 1:30 p.m. Please contact the Faith Formation Office before booking a venue for the celebration. Parents must be registered with our parish. Both sponsors must be over 16 years old, with at least one being a practicing Catholic.



Marriage: The bride and groom should be active members of our parish. The couple should contact the Faith Formation Office at least six months in advance to schedule their marriage, allowing for adequate preparation. Schedule the church date for your marriage before securing your venue.



Funerals: The family of the deceased will coordinate with the chosen funeral home to make the arrangements. The funeral home will then contact the Faith Formation Office at Our Mother of Good Counsel (OMGC) to notify us about the upcoming funeral Mass. We (OMGC) will get in touch with the family and work together to organize the funeral liturgy.



Eucharist for the Homebound and Hospitalized: If you are unable to attend Mass please contact the Parish Office for the Sacraments of the Eucharist. Our Homebound ministry would be happy to assist you.



Anointing of the Sick & Hospital Visits: Please contact the Parish Office if your loved one requires an anointing. Please do not wait until death is imminent to request anointing, as it may take some time to find a priest for the sacrament.



Religious Education: We offer religious education classes for grades 1-8. Call the Faith Formation Office for more information. Classes meet Wednesday, 6:00-7:30PM September through March.
